Culpeper County respects and appreciates the need for staff to experience professional development in a practical manner that allows for individual implementation. On November 24 and 25, teachers will attend three half-day sessions. On November 25, at 1:00 P.M. all faculty members will return to their home schools and meet with their grade level and/or subject area teams. In these breakout sessions teachers will have an opportunity to share what they learned in the workshops and brainstorm ways to integrate the new ideas into their instruction.

A total of ten recertification points will be awarded to any teacher who attends the two days of professional development and signs in at each session. In addition, any workshop presenter will receive additional points for each session at which he/she presents. Points will be based on the number of times presenting, as well as the number of different topics.

In an effort to cross train special education and general education teachers, most training is not segregated. We hope that this will be a meaningful professional development experience for you. You will have the opportunity to give feedback at the end of your workshop.
